3.0	Round Table Discussion – Brexit local intelligence	
	Andrea Witcombe of NFU:	10000
	Generally, farms were larger in Wiltshire and this meant payment claims to Government were larger. There had been delays in payments with

	corresponding negative impacts. Most of the farming trade went to Europe, but the biggest worry was maintenance of agricultural standards if we were to move to WTO arrangements. Mandy Paterson of Inspire by Wessex Chamber: There were business concerns around cash flows. The Chamber was working with members to improve forward planning to cash flow activity at times of anticipated difficulty. There were still high levels of uncertainty and therefore, in too many businesses, a lack of planning. Large businesses were spending a lot of money in preparation for disruption. Andrew Wells of BusinessWest: The quarterly survey across the South West (300 businesses) saw a 17% reduction in export sales and export orders. Business confidence had dropped by 9% and only 37% of businesses felt fully-prepared for Brexit, with 63% feeling not fully-prepared.	
	UKRI in Swindon was expanding by 600 jobs to manage replacement of EU	
	funds.	
	Robin McGowan of Salisbury BID: Footfall in Salisbury for November 2018 had been poor. In December some businesses were a third down, a third had stayed the same and a third had gone up. Generally, it had been better than expected. Although the footfall was down, spend was rising. Vacancy rates for premises were creeping up, but still below the national level. Tim Major of Thames Valley Chamber: There had been a significant range of responses, with the level of preparation not always related to the size of the business. Andy Rhind-Tutt of Salisbury Chamber: More businesses were focussing on the UK. Some businesses were gaining accounts from UK manufacturers which now did not want to source supplies from outside the UK. Phil Clement: Updated members on GPIF loan agreements and the potential of a new call after April 2019. He also gave a progress report on Inward Investment activity related to sector specific work in countries outside the EU.

What training is available?







How much will apprenticeship training cost?

If your annual pay bill is below £3m, you will pay 10% of the cost of apprenticeship training.

Examples:

 Upskill a member of your finance team to achieve CIMA / ACCA costs up to £2100, for the full 3 years.

Recruit a new HR Support apprentice up to £500

Employers can negotiate the cost with a training provider Ensure a qualification is attached to the apprenticeship





Receive a transfer

- Employers who pay the levy can fund one other organisation
- Transfer a maximum of 10% of annual funds
- Can only be used for standards and new starts




