

- Acquisition and assembly of land including to support new housing, workspaces and public realm
- Improvements to transport access, traffic flow and circulation in the area
- Supporting change of use including (where appropriate) housing delivery and densification
- Supporting adaptation of the high street in response to changing technology

Timeline and funding


- **December 2018** Invitation for EOI

- June 2020 Business case submitted
- December 2020 Provisional funding announced (70%)
- Jan-March 2020 Technical update process
- May 2021 Funding confirmed and project commencement
- March 2024 Delivery deadline

Trowbridge - masterplan themes and delivery








- 01 Better movement and legibility at the town centre gateways
- Enable the pedestrianisation of Fore Street.
- Restore the rivers of Trowbridge: Shires & Town Bridge.
- Wayfinding and environmental improvements.
- 02 A unique and culture-and-leisure-led offer
- Refurbish and maximise use of the Town Hall and encourage links to Civic centre.
- Reactivate nearby vacant properties to create Artisan Market type space at Market hall (empty pub adjacent to Town Hall).

03 A resilient and diverse high street

- Encourage conversion of units to facilitate a wider range of shops moving into the area and convert empty upper floors to residential through a programme of grants.
- Create guidance for uses that are needed / wanted in the high street.






Salisbury – FHSF aims

Deliver a step change in the economic vitality of the city centre, meaning:


- Customers will experience the high street in new, authentic ways
