West of England + LSIP Trailblazer

The Skills for Jobs white paper set out the government's blueprint for reshaping the technical skills system to better support the needs of the local labour market and the wider economy.

- Qualitative research build on existing understanding robust, current, granular
- Interviews and immersion events
- Translation of reported needs with training providers
- Five areas within 2 sectors (aerospace & advanced engineering, health & care):
 Business Growth / Workforce Development / Recruitment, retention & upskilling / Technological

change & digitalisation / Climate change & sustainability





LSIP National Rollout

LSIPs: Data-driven projects to improve post-16 technical education and make it more closely aligned to a region's workforce needs. Completed by undertaking robust research and analysis of current and expected needs over a 3-year period, and to then develop a plan of actionable priorities for meaningful collaborative intervention that can be addressed through employers, training providers and stakeholders to drive change.

- Every English LEP area has a designation for LSIP delivery – 38 unique reports and plans
- More focus on collaborative co-design & up/reskilling needs
- Two phases first focussed on research report, May 2023
- Report outcome development of a roadmap for regional intervention and prioritised activity, deep dives and refinements

- Wider integration of needs learner demand, collaborative action
- Evaluation of findings and continual improvement for Phase 2 - development of pathways and collaborative intervention
- Alongside Strategic Development Funds, Skills Bootcamps, announced Local Skills Improvement Fund
- Central Government ideology and commitment to business involvement in planning provision




Initial LSIP 'directions of travel'/findings (4 weeks)

- Big disparity between larger and smaller companies in tech adoption, understanding & needs
- Issues compounded by high staff turnover rates
- Agri data has potential used for control rather than understanding, need common reference points for sustainability
- More delivery aligned with mental health, resilience & wellbeing

- 'Core' digital/IT skills needs general IT, disconnect reported in those trained in IT e.g.
 C++ versus email
- Electronic integrated systems versus paper systems – wider integration, better efficiency, chain of custody
- Losses of legacy skillsets through pandemic and retirements
- Change-adverse processes and often driven by legislation
- Industry into teaching....?
