Performance summary

- SWLEP is 19th on the table of 38 LEPs for its FDI wins in 2021-22
- There were 4 wins that were classed as multi-site, ie, the same company opening premises in multiple sites in the UK. Amazon's move to Swindon is one example.
- The multi-site wins are not allocated to a specific area. If they were, SWLEP would be around 7th in the table for jobs created.
- Thames Valley, West of England and Oxford were 11th, 12th and 13th respectively with 29 project wins each. Heart of the South West were 23rd with 19 wins. Dorset 31st with 13 wins and Gfirst 37th with six wins.
