	<p>Key points outlined:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the success of the ICE 2.0 conference, with the attendance of businesses, schools/colleges and students; and</li> <li>• a key defence prime organisation was interested in SWLEP taking over the lease etc of its new offices. One of the key reasons for this was that it had been based at MOD locations across the country for the past 20 years, operating with MOD as its landlord. Moving out into the commercial world, owing to its background and history, its Change Management Team was not used to dealing in this environment. 	<p>PB spoke to the paper in CS's absence and updated the meeting on the status and progress of the following programmes within business support:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• the Growth Hub;</li> <li>• Inward Investment; and</li> <li>• Growing Places Infrastructure Fund (GPIF) loans.</li> </ul> <p>In addition, RFi requested an outline of the type of support programmes planned for delivery by the Growth Hub and added that it would be sensible for Wiltshire Council to feed into SWLEP's Head of Business Support what else was in the offing. Over the past few years, SWLEP and Wiltshire Council had been successful in not duplicating their offers. More information sharing on this would be beneficial to both.</p> <p>Details had just been issued from government on the operational requirements needed by Growth Hubs. Growth Hub Plus would operate outside these parameters and would be funded from commercial income.</p> <p><b>Action: CS to ensure relevant information was provided to RFi.</b></p> <p>PB advised of work being carried out within the LEP network on the rural economy. SWLEP had access to Labour Market Intelligence (LMI) for every local authority area in England and would be working specifically on LAs which were classified as "mainly rural". There were 41 mainly rural Local Authorities of which Wiltshire was one. SWLEP would investigate which sectors were growing and which were declining and compile an overview of the rural economy, ascertaining the overall balance of rural businesses.</p> <p>Wiltshire Council had been having a dialogue with UWE for some time and funding had just been received from the Vice Chancellor Challenge Fund to progress a</p>	<p><b>July 2023</b></p>
