- Local Skills Reports published in Spring 2021




Evolution triggered by the Skills for Jobs White Paper published by the DfE in January 2021

- build on SAPs and
- go further in putting employers at the heart of local skills systems through new Local Skills Improvement Plans (LSIPs), developed by employer representative bodies (ERBs)
- LSIPs will be developed in a small number of "trailblazer areas", selected by the DfE and announced "in June or July 2021"


The DfE continues to fund SAPs while trailblazing the new LSIPs



- produce high quality, local-level skills analysis
- maintain their local relationships
- refresh their Local Skills Report



- local skills providers' curriculum planning and
- provide an evidence base to support bids to relevant programmes and funds aimed at improving skills, levelling up and local economic recovery/growth



- sharing analysis and intelligence on the local labour market and
- encouraging their existing stakeholders to work collaboratively in supporting the development of the LSIP
