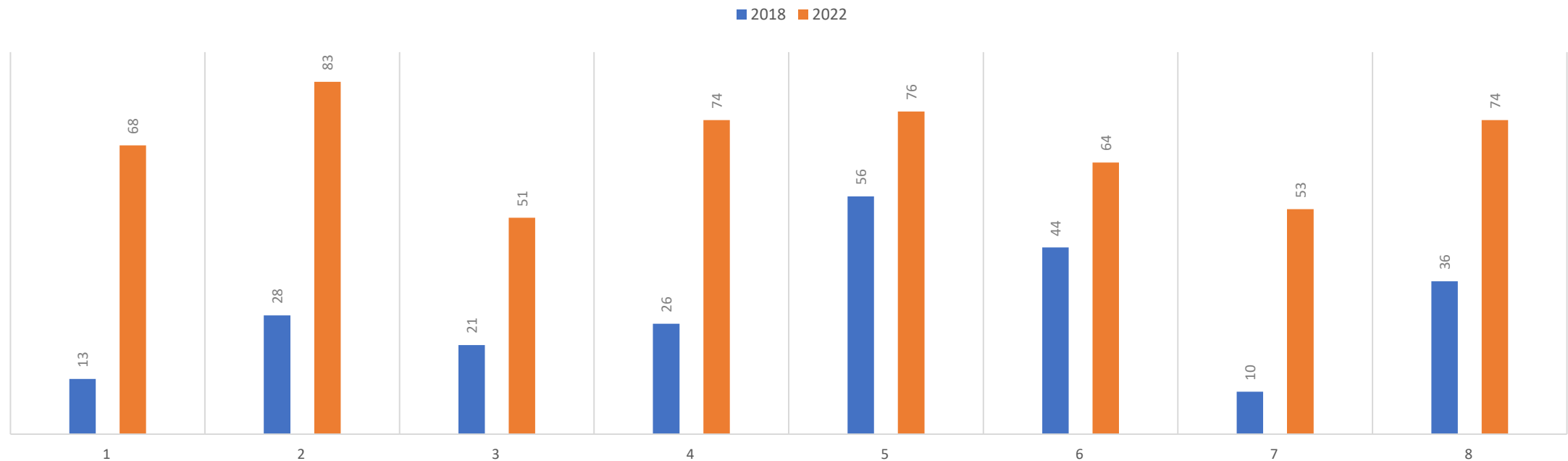

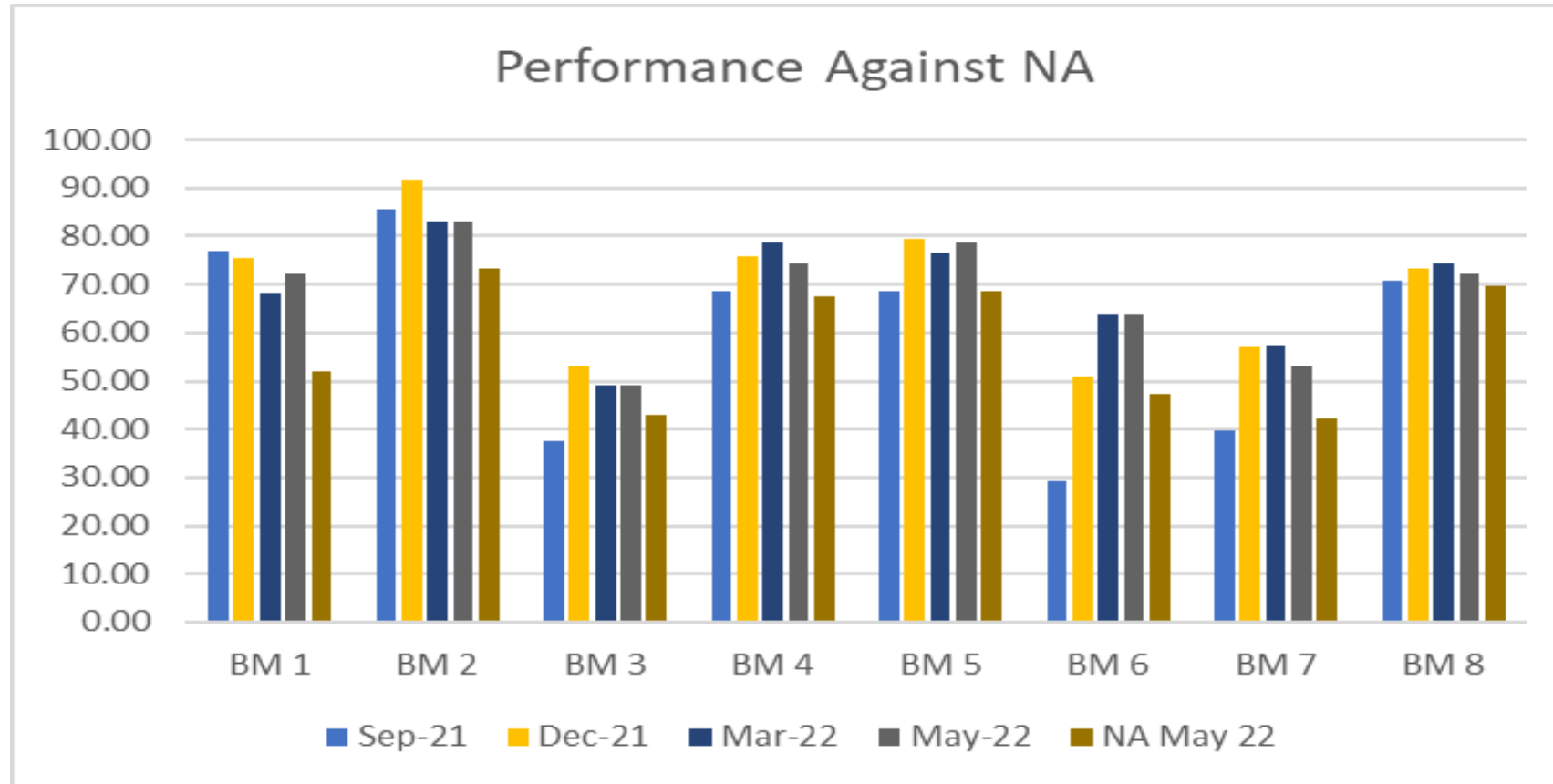

TO APRIL 2022

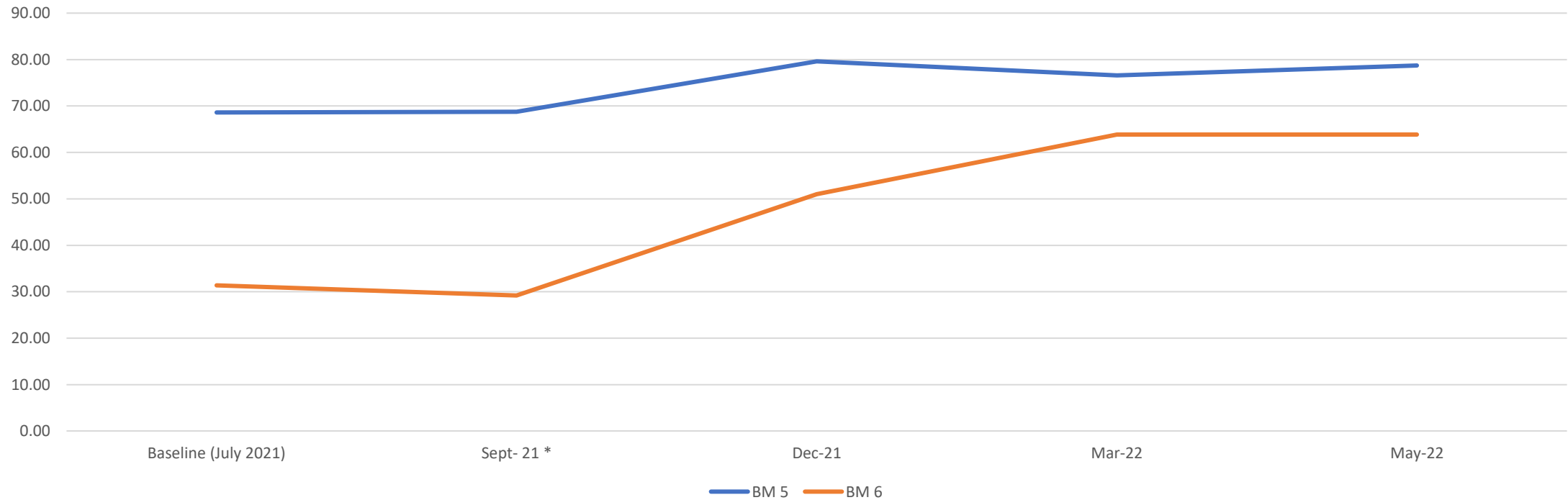


Progress to Date

Network Progress

School/College Network:

- 2018/2019: 40 schools and colleges Careers Hub members
- 2021/2022: 58 schools and colleges (63 sites) Careers Hub members

EA Network:

98% of EAs are matched against a NA of 92%.

85% of mainstream schools/colleges are matched against a NA of 84%: 10 current vacancies

73% of AP and SEND schools are matched against a NA of 68%.

98% of matched institutions in the LEP completed Compass against a NA of 97%.

Additional Activities Undertaken by Careers Hub

- 2 x Transitions Fund projects to reduce the number of NEETs
(£40,000 additional funding received from CEC)
- Hub Incubation Project research the impact of employer engagement in year 7 maths curriculum
(£70,000 additional funding received from CEC)
- Apprenticeship and Technical Education Fund project
(£20,000 additional funding received from CEC)
- SEND LMI Platform development
(£4,000 additional funding received from CEC)

2021/2022 Projects

- 3 x Learn Live events (Your Choices, Amazing Application and WoWFest)
(5,000 attendees per event)
- Delivery by providers of 47 encounters with employers sessions
- Delivery by providers of 7 x discreet 1 day experience of the workplace workshops, for up to 400 students, where no activity was available under school provision.
- Provision of a range of short SEND conferences in partnership with other regional LEPs.
- Provision of S&W Careers Conference on June 16th 2022

Targets for 2022/2023

- 58 schools and colleges to engage with the Careers Hub (achieved)
- An EA to be recruited for every school/college (currently 10 vacancies)
- 90% of schools colleges to achieve no fewer than 3 Gatsby Benchmarks (currently 88%)
- 80% of schools colleges to achieve BM1 (currently 72%)
- BM 5 and 6 to make progress throughout the year (on target)
- 90% of schools to upgrade to Compass+ (currently 70%)
- 75% of Compass+ users to be frequent users
- 25% of Compass+ users to complete the Future Skills Questionnaire
