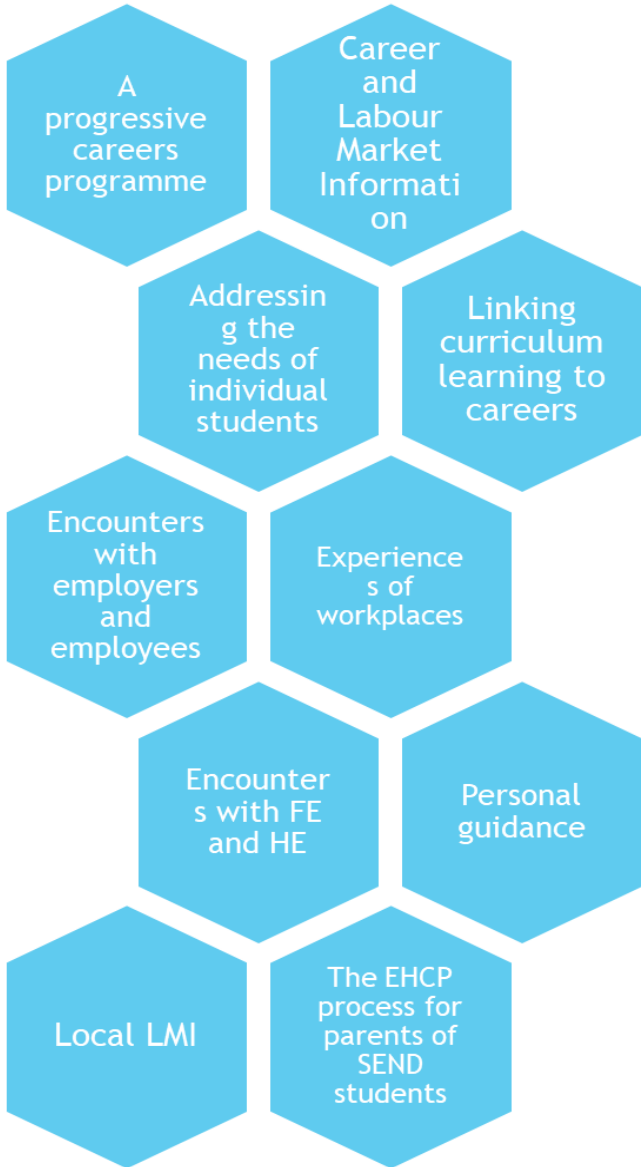


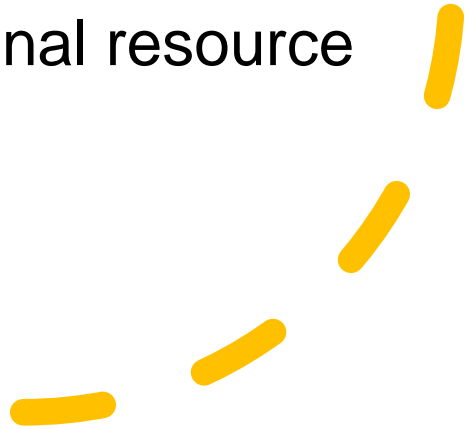
# Research Question: Does the provision of appropriate resources for parents/carers, increase the overall career readiness of electively home educated (EHE) young people?



# Problem

- Parents/carers are key influencers in young people's career decisions, but their knowledge of careers opportunities may be limited or outdated.
- EHE young people do not have access to school/college careers provision that mitigates the limitations of advice from parents/carers.
- The risk is growing as more families choose to home educate.

# Resources Needed

- Access to EHE families across Swindon and Wiltshire.
  - Engagement of a design group of approximately 10 parents/carers.
  - Engagement of a testing group of up to 100 parents/carers.
  - Access to existing content of training modules for Careers Leaders.
  - Technical expertise to create the final resource using an appropriate platform.
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# Activities

- Adapt existing Careers Leader material for use by EHE parents/carers.
- Adapt/create new material to support parents/carers of SEND young people with an EHCP.
- Create new material, relevant to EHE parents/carers, relating to local LMI.
- Engage the expertise of EHE parents/carers to co-design 10 modules.
- Engage the expertise of EHE parents/carers to test and provide feedback on all 10 modules.
- Engage an external provider to build/create the host platform for 10 modules.

# Outcomes

- EHE parents/carers feel more confident supporting their young people to make career choices.
- EHE young people have access to a progressive careers programme that meets their individual needs.
- EHE young people are not disadvantaged, even though they do not have access to school/college-based careers education.
- EHE young people find their best next step, with the support of knowledgeable, well-connected, confident parents/carers.
- EHE young people have access to high quality, 21st Century careers education.
