Structural Changes

Careers Hub now sits within the School Effectiveness Team in Wiltshire Council. The majority of the Employment and Skills Team now sit within the Targeted Education Team.

Swindon Borough Council are considering a number of proposals which have been identified to close an unprecedented budget gap of almost £40m for 2023-24.

Grant Offer funding for 2023/2024 is expected from the CEC in the coming weeks.

Focus from 2023/2024 will be related to areas of disadvantage and there will be central funding to carry out project in this area such as working to prevent NEETs.










Performance Data: December 2022



All Hub schools/colleges to achieve at least 3 BMs.

From the baseline in July 2022, where 9 institutions (16%) were assessing at less than 3 benchmarks fully achieved, the current figure is 6 institutions (10.7%), an improvement of 3 in total.

3 remained stable, 2 improved their performance and 1 dropped from 8BMs to 0 in this period.

Overall, 30% of the wider network are recording 7 or 8 BMs fully complete.

- 9 institutions have recorded 8 BMs fully complete.
- 8 institutions have recorded 7 BMs fully complete.

Actions in place:

Ongoing EC and CL 1to1 meetings held termly, with institutions RAG rated as red being seen monthly.

Monthly tracking of individual performance via team meetings to ensure ongoing progress and to identify themes to focus on.

January performance reports detailed the areas for improvement of the lowest performing institutions, with targets set to improve.











90% of compatible schools to have moved to Compass+:

Currently 35 users onboard (69%), with 16 users (31%) not migrated.

75% of these users should be 'frequent users':

Currently 10 users (20%) are 'frequent users'.

Actions in place:

Compass+ session was held in November, a series of webinars have been shared with CLs, a team Compass+ champion has been identified, localised events are being timetabled with the CEC to promote the platform use.

 - 2 of the 6 schools/colleges achieving less than 3 benchmarks (both Swindon)





Careerpilot

The Careers Hub is funding access to the Careerpilot platform for Swindon and north Wiltshire schools/colleges after Study Higher was no longer able to provide this financial cover.

To date 17 schools in the Wiltshire and Swindon area have met the criteria to become Careerpilot Super Users and 5000+ students are registered/active on the site since September.

Provider Access Legislation (January 2023)

Schools must provide at least six encounters with approved providers of apprenticeships and technical education for all their students:

- Two encounters for pupils during the 'first key phase' (year 8 or 9)
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'second key phase' (year 10 or 11)
- Two encounters for pupils during the 'third key phase' (year 12 or 13)

A key mechanism to further help learners understand and take-up, not just apprenticeships, but wider technical education options such as T-Levels and Higher Technical Qualifications.
