Our research and analysis gathered from Home Educated parents/carers across Swindon and Wiltshire, clearly highlighted that there's a real need for this group to have access to quality information, relevant career next steps guidance, signposting to opportunities, options forward, services and events to support their children and young people to make informed decisions that are right for them.

The home educating co-design team of parents/carers met regularly to discuss needs and identify/test resources.

The structure and system of the resource section should follow a standard pattern





















Top Most Beneficial Sections for Home Educating Parents:
